On the Hebrew calendar, Tu B'Shvat ("the 15th of the month of Shvat") is the New Year of the Trees. The Kabbalists took this minor agricultural holiday and gave it new significance by inventing for it a ritual celebration, modeled on the Passover Seder and invoking such powerful imagery as the seasons of the year.
